RESOLVED, to rename reserve fund A247 to General Capital Improvement fund. This reserve fund was approved in the 2025 budget process and allotted \$50,000.

RESOLVED, to close out reserve fund A236 Litigation with approximately \$38.86 and move funds into A fund balance.

FIRE HYDRANT REPLACEMENT PLAN:

The Town owns 41 fire hydrants. 8 hydrants are currently having issues, one is from 1953, and the others are from 1977. These 8 hydrants will need to be replaced. We recently replaced a broken hydrant that had a fee of around \$4900. Supervisor Butler suggested replacing a couple a year until they are fixed. As this is a standard labor rate from the Village and the parts will be at cost, we would not have to get quotes or put this out to bid. This would cost the Town approximately \$10,000 per year. The funds would come from our water repair reserve.

Dear Chad Cooke,

This is in response to your requests from June 10, 2024, for speed limit reductions on Spotswood Drive, Creekview Court, Adirondack Estate Court, Trout Pond Road, Wedgewood Way, Wells Estate Court, Hamm Road, and Locust Ridge Drive in the Town of Corinth. Currently, all of the roads are unposted and, therefore, governed by the statewide 55 mph speed limit.

Based on our review, we have determined that a reduction of the speed limit is warranted on several roads. We have written a Notice of Order establishing a 25 mph area speed limit for Creek View Court, Adirondack Estate Court, Trout Pond Road, and Wedgewood Way. We have also written Notices of Order establishing 25 mph linear speed limits for Spotswood Drive, Hamm Road, and Locust Ridge Drive. Wells Estate Court was found to be approximately 500 feet in length. It is the Department's policy not to establish a linear speed limit for less than 1/4 mile in length. Based on this criterion, we are denying your request for a speed limit reduction on Wells Estate Court. Upon receipt of this Order, which is currently being filed with the Secretary of State, you may arrange to have the appropriate speed limit signs installed in accordance with the 2023 MUTCD and NYS Supplement.

The holiday was first celebrated in Texas, where on that date in 1865, in the aftermath of the Civil War, enslaved people were declared free under the terms of the 1862 Emancipation Proclamation.

The Town does not currently recognize Juneteenth as a holiday with pay or days off. Is this a holiday that should be added to our holiday schedule? This is a Holiday that will change days each year and would increase the payroll budget for any position that employees are required to work. A discussion was held amongst the Town Board, department heads and public.
